La Crosse Elementary

La Crosse Elementary is located at 511 Elm St. The student population is approximately 150. Faculty and staff include 11 teachers, 5 paraprofessionals, 1 secretary, 1 custodian, and 1 principal.

La Crosse Elementary has earned the honor of being a Kansas "School of Excellence", along with 7 State Standard of Excellence awards out of a possible 8. The elementary computer infrastructure is wireless and currently has 1 to 1 laptops with additional Ipads in every classroom. iPads are in use daily in most if not all classrooms. Other programs include, Title I Reading Program, Guided Reading, after school Homework Helpers, a "Family" Character ed program, and "Jump Start" summer school.

All classrooms are equipped with mounted projectors, Promethium Interactive Whiteboards, and apple TV's. The class size is approximately 15 to 1 student/teacher ratio.

Elementary activities include Homework Helpers: M-TH 3:35-4:15. Band for 5th & 6th graders daily, K-6 PE & Music daily.



La Crosse Middle School

La Crosse Middle School includes the seventh and eighth grades. The middle school and high school share the same buildings located at 400 Washington St. There are approximately 50 students. Teachers are shared with the High School.

La Crosse Middle School has continually earned Standard of Excellence awards. Two mobile laptop computer labs with 30 in each are used daily. The middle school curriculum includes the basics (English, Math, Science and Social Studies) plus Technology, Art, Band, Chorus, Computers, Reading, Agriculture, Woods, Expressive Arts, and Stem classes. There are a wide variety of extra curricular options to choose from: football, volleyball, basketball, track and cheerleading, StuCo, FFA, SADD, and Quiz Bowl.



La Crosse High School

La Crosse High School is located at 400 Washington Street. The Faculty consists of 14 full time teachers, (some of which also teach MS classes), two special ed teachers and paraprofessionals. The enrollment of the high school (9-12) is approximately 90 students.

There are five 30+ mobile laptop units and one stationary business lab with both PC and Apple computers, along with Chrome Books. The building is also wireless with unlimited computer access. The MS/HS library is fully automated.



A diverse curriculum for students pursuing general or college studies is available. The curriculum offered includes 4 levels of English, 4 levels of Math, Biology, Adv. Biology, Adv. Chemistry, Earth/Space Science, Plant Science, Government, History, PE/Health, Physical Conditioning, several levels of Computer Science, Woods, Agricultural studies, CAD, Journalism, Yearbook, FACS, Band and Vocal. The school offers distance learning classes which include: College Algebra, English Comp I & II, Spanish, Speech, Sociology, and Psychology.

The Character Education program at LMS/LHS occurs in teacher advisory groups referred to as C.A.M.P.—an acronym for Counselor, Advisor, Mentor, and Pal, which are all roles the educator serves for his/her assigned group. The program is designed to address six pillars of character education, as well as bullying behaviors, both on a regular basis. The idea is that teachers develop a strong, trusting, professional rapport with their assigned group, and the individual student view their CAMP Director as someone who will guide and support them.

The following extra curricular activities are available at LHS: volleyball, football, cross country, cheerleading, basketball, track, golf, FFA, SADD, scholars bowl, and StuCo.
